"On Sunday morning 12th July, I wrote the word "Foreword" at
"the top of a clean sheet of paper, and then went on with my Sunday
"duties, not returning to that blank sheet until today, Wednesday 15th
"July. Last Sunday the old College building stood as I have known it for
"thirty years. Today, as I look out of the Library window, gaping holes
"stare at me where before were shuttered windows; the tiled roof has
"gone and the builders are trying to fell the kitchen chimney, much as a
"woodman will fell a forest tree. The old College building, from billiard
"room to the Chapel front stands a gutted shell. Dun; Lockwood; Farran,
"Sketchley; Dickinson; Cutts; Caldwell Dormitories all are gone. The
"Dining Room and Kitchen, the Masters' Dining Room, which was my
"first home within the College grounds, the Matron's room and three
"Masters' flats exist no longer; only the outer fringes remain; the old
"billiard room, lately the Junior School Dining room, the Book room;
"the vegetable dump; and last but not least the Agar Dormitory and its
"bathroom below remain the only serviceable buildings, as we begin to
"look round for space in which to house and feed ourselves. Even as I
"write these words the masonic woodsmen complete their task and the
"chimney, with its lightning conductor projecting from the top, topples,
"breaks, and falls into the ruins, the middle section breaking through the
"Dining Hall floor into the cellar below. So ends the old building where
"St. George's was founded sixty years ago".

The College authorities have taken all the urgent measures required since the fire which deprived St. George's of important buildings. But the need to rebuild is greater than ever, because the fire has obliged them to take steps which, perhaps, should have been done before.

FOR ALL THIS WE NEED YOUR HELP

Insurance covered the cost of rebuilding everything as it was, \$ 7.024.512.—. But no one wants to replace things which are obsolete or no longer satisfactory, so that money is being used to satisfy the most urgent need, namely, dining halls, kitchen and pantries all of which are being built and should be ready for use in March 1961.

The sum of \$ 22.000.000.— must now be found in order to build the two dormitory blocks and so finish the job.
